WDVR IS NEW ALL OVER AGAIN

Thanks to you, our loyal listeners and your generous financial support over the years, huge changes have taken place at WDVR. If you're a long-time listener, you probably know the story of WDVR's humble beginnings. It wasn't a loud, dramatic start with grand celebration, ribbon cuttings and politicians giving speeches. It was more like a quiet: "Hi folks we're here and we want to be your station". It's a story about a small station operating from a former blacksmith shop with donated and borrowed equipment and transmitting a 500 watt signal from atop the village water tower. Since those primitive beginnings WDVR has steadily grown in listenership, power and technology.



At five pm on that momentous Monday in 1990, when I flipped the switch for the first time, WDVR could not boast a single listener. Our one, sparsely equipped studio was a collection of hand-me-downs from other stations. The centerpiece was a Vintage, 1970s Gates Executive console, lovingly vacuum cleaned, de-cobwebbed and re-wired. Our transmitter, a Gates Model-FM 1K, rescued from the back room of an Ohio station, stood ready for the debut in a cramped 6 by 8 foot garden shed at the base of the 75 foot water tower.

Now, after almost 20 years, you have allowed us to do it all over again—but this time with all new state-of-the-art, digital equipment. WDVR is now completely rebuilt from the ground up with two new, instantly switchable, gleaming air studios, a production room, a new antenna atop a new, 180-foot transmission tower and new, modern transmitter building, on property owned outright by WDVR.

None of these great changes would have been possible without your generous, financial support over the last 19 years. The



work we've done in the last two years has secured WDVR's ability to continue serving you in the future. We hope we can rely on you to support us again in this present fundraiser.

Mark: "I've been listening since 1996. I used to drive to New York City every Saturday night and, while searching the dial, I heard music you just don't hear anymore - the Big Band sound. As I continued to lis-

Ginny: "But you left out some very important information, Mark. You probably logged in as many hours working on the restructuring of the studios as I did. You were always there to move cabinets, cut wood, screw down boards, rearrange the library, then rearrange it again, and clean up. (You even changed your fingernail color to black & blue when we dropped a file cabinet on it). All the while you kept us laughing through what others might have considered less than fun.."

Mark: "It was fun. I didn't considerate it work, especially when I got to meet this crazy nurse who kept chasing me with a carpenters drill. She was determined to change my fingernail back to its original color, pink, by using no anesthesia and just

her drill, OUCH." "I think her nursing degree came from the Carpenter's Union."

We arrived early to pick up the tick-

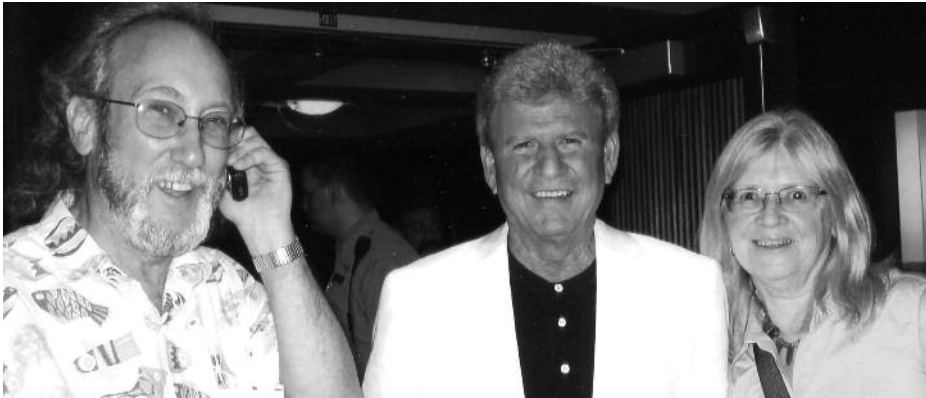
